II. GUEST SPEAKER: Scott Sweeney - Board Member

- School safety is a priority. The February 15th CCSD Board Meeting had a strong focus on safety. WATCH THE BOARD MEETING.
 - o CCSD has largest police force of any district in Georgia.
 - Alert Point is in process of rolling out. Alert Point is a system that allows every staff member to initiate a code red by pushing a button. Immediate communication to Cobb Schools Police and Cobb County Police.
- General Assembly in session.
 - o Threats to public education
 - Diversion of funds
- \$167million in austerity cuts expected this year
- Clout of education community is powerful. Don't hesitate to advocate.

II. GUEST SPEAKER: Irene Barton - Updates from Legislature & Advocacy

- ANALYSIS OF GEORGIA'S PROPOSED ECUCATION BUDGET BY THE GEORGIA BUDGET & POLICY INSTITUTE
- This is an increase in the dollar amount over last year, but includes items that are more costly than previous years.
 - o increased enrollment
 - o increased Medicaid
 - shoring up TRS
 - o \$23M for health & foster care
 - Austerity cuts (\$167m) still in budget
 - o Since 2003, austerity cuts have provided education \$9B in funding shortfalls
- Bills to Watch
 - o HB 743 Cardiac Arrest Prevention Bill (being aware of signs of cardiac arrest)
 - HB 672 Speed Detection Devices. Ability for school personnel use speed detection devices near a school. Spurred by loss of Cobb crossing guard.
 - HB 673 Distracted Driver. Sponsored by John Carson, Cobb Delegation. PTA has a statement position on distracted driving.
 - Link to PTA Resolution on DISTRACTED DRIVING
 - HB 781 Sales & Use Tax Revision of Tax for Education Purposes. Could change some of procedures for spending SPLOST dollars and allow for use for maintenance and operations.
 - HB 482 Georgia Education Scholarship Bill. Voucher bill: Education Savings Account.
 Redirect state money from public education to fund private education. Introduces new cost to state.
 - This could impact public education \$23M-\$69M by year 4 if it passes
 - HB 918 Revenue & Taxation. Federal tax revision put a larger burden on individuals in several states.
 - Delta Fuel Tax included
 - SB 362 Establishment Innovative Assessment Pilot Program. Testing & Required testing.
 Districts could drop some required testing and replace with better student assessment.
