The Walton High School Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Academy offers students a rigorous curriculum driven by problem solving and discovery in a student-centered environment and is designed for students who have a desire and passion to pursue one of three majors: Advanced Mathematics and Science, Engineering, or Biomedical Science. #### International Spanish Academy (ISA)

The International Spanish Academy (ISA) at Walton High School is a very rigorous educational program in Spanish and English offered through the collaboration of Walton High School with the Ministry of Education of Spain. Students must apply and be accepted into this program.

Graduating ISA students have taken four years of intensive Spanish at Walton and four Honors or AP content area courses that included a delivery component in Spanish. Approximately 30% of an ISA student's overall coursework is conducted in Spanish. ISA students take an AP exam at the end of each AP course in the program. #### Pathway Programs

Walton High School offers complete pathways in the following areas: Financial Marketing Services Career Pathway, Computing Career Pathway, Therapeutic Services-Physical Medicine Career Pathway, Graphic Design Career Pathway, Broadcast/Video Production Career Pathway, and Engineering and Technology Concentration Pathway (based on the national curriculum of Project Lead the Way).

### Grading, Ranking, and Ethics

Grade Point Average (GPA) is computed on a 4.0 scale, with extra quality points given for honors courses, AP courses, courses beyond AP, and the 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> year of a world language. GPA calculation includes all courses on the transcript.

Numeric grades on the transcript are the actual grades a student has earned. Extra quality points are only added to the overall weighted GPA on the transcript. **Walton High School does not rank.** Walton High School reports all high school discipline that has resulted in an out-of-school suspension.

### Cobb County School District Response to the Impact of COVID-19

For the 2020-2021 school year, the Cobb County school district put the following COVID-19 procedures into place:

- The start date for students was moved from August 3, 2020 to August 17, 2020 and the school year ended as planned on May 26, 2021.
- All students began the school year in a virtual learning environment. High School students had the option to return to face-to-face or remain virtual beginning November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
  - Some schools may have limited their course offerings based on beginning the year virtually.
  - Students and families again had an option of returning face-to-face or remaining virtual to begin the second semester and a final option offered mid-February to begin after Spring Break
  - All students had an asynchronous learning day each week on Wednesday as a virtual remediation day
- EOC testing was changed in the state of Georgia to only require Algebra I, Biology, American Lit, and US History and all EOC test scores would be weighted 0.01% of the course's final grade.
- All grades assigned were as earned – there was no Pass/Fail grades given and the grading scale/graduation requirements were not changed.

**Curriculum**

Walton High School is on a traditional semester schedule where students take six classes each day. Students can choose to take one additional course online per semester through Cobb Virtual Academy (CVA) or Georgia Virtual School (GAVS). In the past we have offered a few courses through our morning tuition school to allow for an additional course per semester, however this option has not been available to the Class of 2022 since the 2019-2020 school year.
